PLEASE INFORM THE NURSE OR PHYSICIAN IF YOU HAVE A HISTORY OF ASTHMA

For Your Appointment: Allergy testing is performed on the back or arms. Please eat before your test is performed.

Insurance: Please check with your insurance provider for your benefits information for allergy testing, allergy injections, and allergy serum prior to testing. If you test positive for allergens and elect to begin allergy injections, you will need to pre-pay before any serum is mixed.

Certain medications can interfere with the testing process. Herbal remedies and herbal drinks (including herbal tea) can also interfere with the testing process. It is very important to communicate with our team to review <u>all</u> medications and all herbal supplements <u>prior</u> to your testing!

Do not take **ANY ANTIHISTAMINES** for **AT LEAST 7 DAYS** before your testing. Antihistamines are for allergy relief and will interfere with the results of your test. (This includes both prescribed medications and over-the-counter medications.)

Please avoid the following medications that are sold by prescription or over-the-counter:
